



Our Mission Statement

How Long Does the Program Take?

The Aviation Program offers students a career path progression that consists of the following (new certificates pending State approval):

- Aviation Certificate I – Private Pilot (16 units)
- Aviation Certificate II – Instrument Pilot (23 units)
- Aviation Certificate III – Commercial Pilot (32 units)
- Aviation Certificate IV – Advanced Pilot (36 units)
- Associate in Science Degree Commercial Pilot*

**Students interested in transferring or earning an Associate Degree will also want to complete the General Education requirements outlined in the Cypress College Catalog (25 additional units)*

Students may attend part-time or full-time. Generally, students who attend full-time take 12-18 units per semester, enabling them to complete a degree in about two years.

To complete qualifications for employment, students arrange for their own flight training. Cypress College accepts no liability for the flight training so obtained.

Equipment

Cypress College Aviation operates "Precision Flight Controls Cirrus II" aviation training devices (ATD), which meet the Part 61 FAR requirements for instrument flight training (10 hours) and instrument currency requirements. The ATDs simulate a variety of aircraft from the Cessna, Beechcraft and Mooney products including multi-engine aircraft. With the GPS basic system, we can also "go" to any place in the U.S. in real time which allows flight planning for fuel stops and alternate weather scenarios confronting pilots. Instructors can also simulate failed equipment and set up a variety of emergency situations.

Advisory Committee

The Aviation curriculum is aligned with industry requirements through an advisory committee. This group is composed of leaders from the airlines, the FAA, and general aviation flight training as well as business flying and airport operations and management.

Club & Extracurricular Activities

Cypress College Aviation students also participate in a number of extra curricular activities. Cypress has an active chapter of Alpha Eta Rho, the international aviation fraternity, and a precision flying team, which participates in the Pacific Coast Intercollegiate Flying Association and the National Intercollegiate Flying Association events. Opportunities for flying gliders and model aircraft are also available.
